1. Great Bear LIVE on Indiegogo until Dec. 4th, 2013

Great Bear LIVE is an innovative research project and conservation tool that transmits live wildlife video and audio streams from the heart of the Great Bear Rainforest to your personal computer, anywhere in the world, via www.pacificwild.org. By sharing the hidden world of B.C.'s exquisite and wild coast, we not only directly connect people with this remote region, but also educate the world about the many threats this pristine ecosystem faces.



Live footage of wolves is streamed directly into the Bella Bella School, where students can control the cameras.

Our current system allows us incredible daytime non-invasive and remote observation of some of the planet's most elusive wildlife, but we are not yet able to bring you the full picture of the Great Bear. **We need your help to advance our technology so we can observe previously unseen wildlife behaviour in challenging environments: in total darkness and underwater.**

We are using Indiegogo, an online crowdfunding platform which allows us 30 days to pitch our story, purpose and cause to the world. **We have 21 days left and we need you to help us meet our**

2. Your Voice is Needed

Last week, B.C. and Alberta Premiers Christy Clark and Allison Redford announced a framework agreement that they say will allow energy projects to transport products, like crude oil, through B.C. to overseas markets. The agreement includes Redford's endorsement of Clark's five conditions for supporting oil-pipeline development in B.C., and enables continued negotiations around the proposed Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipeline project.

But what does this new agreement really mean when it comes to safeguarding the environment and the rights of First Nations from the risks associated with massive pipeline and tankers projects?



Say No To Tankers!

Not much, because Alberta doesn't have jurisdiction over -and therefore is not accountable for- most of the areas of concern in the list of conditions.

The discussion needs to be moved away from Christy Clark's five conditions, and back to **protecting our coast, climate and communities.**
