The Enbridge Joint Review Panel will be releasing the 'Panel Report' any day now, recommending whether or not tar sands oil should be shipped through the Great Bear Rainforest. Following the release of this report, the Federal Government will have 180 days to make a final decision based on what it has described as being in the "nation's interest."

This means that we have a small window of opportunity to remind our Federal government and elected officials what exactly *is* in the national interest: *clean water, wild salmon, quiet sanctuaries for killer and humpback whales, intact ecosystems, vibrant communities and an economy rooted in sustainability.*
