

GRIZZLY BEARS

Threat: Government-sanctioned killing & habitat loss driven by logging, road building, & human expansion.

Action: Public campaigns & advocacy that helped end the grizzly bear trophy hunt in B.C.

Our Goal: Provincial legislation permanently bans grizzly bear hunting.

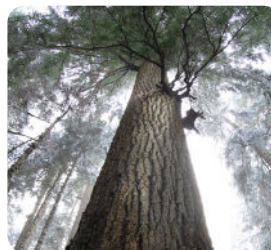


B.C. WOLVES

Government-sanctioned wolf culls plus unregulated hunting & trapping.

Public campaigns, legal action, & advocacy to end the wolf cull.

The provincially funded wolf cull ends. Regulations &/or legislation limit hunting & trapping of wolves.

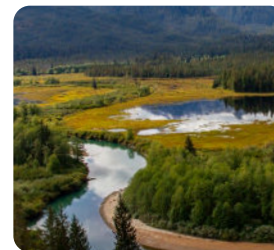


ANCIENT FORESTS

Continued industrial logging of the last remaining old-growth forests in British Columbia.

Public campaigns & advocacy to stop old-growth logging & secure lasting protection.

Provincial legislation in B.C. bans the logging of remaining intact ancient forests.



LAND ECOSYSTEMS

Logging, road building, & expanding industrial activity that fragment habitat & degrade ecosystems.

Public campaigns & advocacy to protect connected habitats & secure lasting ecosystem-level protections.

Connected, high-quality habitats are protected for wide-ranging & at-risk species including caribou, grizzly bears & marbled murrelets.



WILD PACIFIC SALMON

Threat: Open-net pen salmon farms in B.C.'s coastal waters are exposing wild salmon to disease, parasites, & pollution.

Action: Public campaigns and advocacy, including petitions and letter-writing campaigns.

Our Goal: The 2029 ban on open-net pen salmon farms in Canada's Pacific waters is fully implemented.

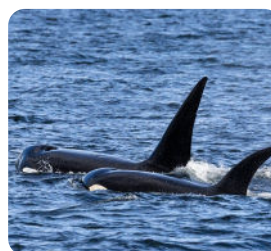


PACIFIC HERRING

Government mismanagement and industrial fisheries driving the collapse of herring populations.

Public letter writing campaigns, Indigenous partnerships, & policy advocacy to reform fisheries management and rebuild herring populations.

A moratorium is placed on industrial herring fisheries in priority regions, to support population recovery.

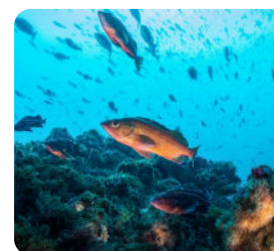


WHALES TO ROCKFISH

Indiscriminate fishing methods that kill non-target species & destroy seafloor habitats.

Public campaigns & advocacy to reform trawl fisheries, reduce bycatch, & require selective fishing practices.

Federal regulations reduce trawl bycatch & phase out indiscriminate fishing techniques by requiring selective gear & practices & strengthening monitoring & accountability.



MARINE ECOSYSTEMS

Insufficient protection & industrial activity degrading marine habitats.

Public campaigns to strengthen & establish marine protected areas, uphold the tanker ban, & protect ocean habitats from destructive activities.

- The Great Bear Sea Marine Protected Area (MPA) network fully implemented.
- 2019 minimum protection standards applied across all of B.C.'s MPAs.
- The tanker moratorium is upheld.
- Ban bottom trawling to protect marine substrates.
